- Consider Asan's 'Fallen Flower as a meditation on the fleeting nature of human life'.
- Elaborate the tripartite relationship between God, Man and Nature in G.M. Hopkin's poetry and philosophy.
- Critically evaluate Chaucer's portrayal of Wife of Bath and the literary significance of her tale in *Canterbury Tales*. (3x12=36)
