4. <u>Campus Recruitment and Placement Drive</u>

Our Values Charter has English Proficiency and Soft Skill Training for a career suited to each one's aptitude as one of its constituents.

It is a matter of great pride to declare that the students who complete their studies here normally secure lucrative jobs. The Department of Journalism here has shaped 180 journalists for the mainstream media within a short span of 12 years. Our past pupils work as News Presenters, Programme Anchors, , Programme Producers, Reporters, Subeditors, Cameramen, and Visual Editors on leading Television Channels like Asianet News, Manorama News, Mathrubhumi News, Reporter, Amrita, Kairali, Jaihind, Jeevan, Surya, Media One and Doordarshan. Our students work as reporters and subeditors in mainstream newspapers: Times of India, The Hindu, The New Indian Express, Deccan Chronicle, Malayala Manorama, Mathrubhoomi, Deepika, Desabhimani and Mangalam. Over 30 students serve as lecturers in colleges and teachers in Plus Two.

About 75 students who completed MSW from here are working abroad, and the others, in various Government Departments, NGOs, and reputed organizations. They work with Childline, SOS Children's Village, Kudumbashree, National AIDS Control Organization, (NACO) Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), Counsellors in Schools, Welfare Officers at Harrisons Malayalam Limited, KITEX, Anna Aluminium Limited, Century Apparels, and as Assistant Professors in Colleges.

The first batches of MA and MCom students who finished their studies in 2015 are also on track, with the placement drive going on in full swing.

We should feel proud of our institution because two leading Software Companies in India, WIPRO and TCS (Tata Consultancy Services), are at Don Bosco Institutes of Higher Education for Campus Recruitment to recruit candidates from various colleges in the districts of Kasaragod, Kannur, Wayanad and Kozhikode.
